RICHARDSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MARCH 6, 2024

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Richardson County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Caverzagie at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 6, 2024. Roll call was answered by Karas, Sickel and Caverzagie. The Invocation was given by Chairman Caverzagie and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice-Chairman Sickel. Chairman Caverzagie announced that the open meeting laws have been posted at the entrance to the meeting room.

A motion was made by Sickel to approve the minutes of the February 21, 2024, meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Caverzagie. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-abstain, Sickelaye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Caverzagie to approve the Board of Equalization minutes of the February 21, 2024, meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Sickel. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-abstain, Sickel-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Caverzagie to approve the minutes of the February 28, 2024, meeting as presented with one correction being noted and completed. Motion seconded by Karas. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Sickel-abstain, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Karas to approve the agenda as posted. Motion seconded by Sickel. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Sickel-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried. ROAD & BRIDGE DEPT.

Highway Superintendent, Steve Darveau, Jr. updated the Board on the maintenance being done on county roads and bridges this past week.

A notice to bidders was reviewed to solicit bids for the purchase of road rock to be received by and opened by the Board until Wednesday, March 27, 2024, at 9:15 a.m. This notice was approved for publication.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Chief Deputy, Jeremiah Franks updated the Board on the routine business within the Law Enforcement Center this past week, reporting that there are currently 16 inmates being held at the jail. A new employee to serve as the dispatch supervisor was hired and started duties on Monday, March 4, Ashley Fischer. It was also reported that plans are underway to organize a golf scramble at the end of June for the benefit of the K-9 Drug Dog program with all proceeds from the fund raiser event to assist in the maintenance and continued training of the drug dogs in Richardson County.

Motion was made by Karas to withdraw quote #Q-40817-1 with Omnigo Software, LLC and to approve the revised quote, #Q-40817-2 adding the additional costs for \$10,001.42 for interface service, making the total amount for this software package now \$124,837.60 payable over a 5 year period (1st--\$22,592.56, 2nd--\$23,722.20, 3rd--\$24,908.24, 4th--\$26,153.51, 5th--\$27,461.09). Also reviewed at this time was the current salary of the clerical position in the office and a request was made for this to be increased. The Board will consider this request further at next week's meeting.

BRIAN KIRKENDALL, EMA DIRECTOR

Brian Kirkendall, EMA Director requested approval to fill an open position that has been vacant to assist on the radiological response team. There are 11 positions on this team and filling this vacancy will keep it at 10.
